



GARAGE SCENE - PROGRESS REPORT ON LIL DARLIN'S TRANSPLANT



Steve Brehm presented a bill for the mailing of the Cruz News. Ron Willson made a motion to pay the bill. It was seconded by Craig Duntley, and the motion passed. New income was given to Anne from Jim Neher for membership renewals.

Membership Chairperson: Jim Neher reported Club membership is 79 (135 total). He had up to date Club rosters.

Activities: Ron Willson reported that he'll be setting up the monthly Culvers get togethers.

Events: Rose Barclay reported that the next Ladies Get Together is Thursday, February 5, at 11:30 a.m. at the Apple Valley American Legion.

Announcements: Duane Barclay reminded members that Club plaques are available from Ron Willson for \$30. Judy Kemper reported that Terry Stade was hospitalized and is now at Good Samaritan in Maple Grove.

Old Business: Mark Peterson sent information to Duane Barclay that visits to our two websites were up in 2025 from 2024.

New Business: (1) Duane Barclay will contact DCTC about bringing the Club's charitable donation. (2) Tim Gardner again will do a video presentation for 2026. (3) Craig Duntley reported that the blue Club jacket is no longer available. (4) Ray Valdovinos brought up the idea of doing an 18 month Club calendar. (5) Jerry Baldwin spoke about the gatherings at Applebees in Eagan on Mondays at 4:30 p.m. and encouraged Club members to attend.

TSS Business: Ray Valdovinos reported: (1) Buck Hill is charging \$600 for the TSS. Ron Willson made a motion to pay Buck Hill the \$600. Ed Mueller seconded the motion, and it passed. (2) Paulie and Spitz will be the same DJ's. They are charging \$1200 and will need half for a deposit. Tim Gardner made a motion to pay the \$600 deposit. Craig Duntley seconded the motion, and it passed. NOTE: The sound system will be upgraded. (3) The date for the TSS (The Summer Spectacular) is Sunday, August 23, 9:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. (4) There was a discussion about raising the price for car admittance. Ray Valdovinos made a motion to charge \$15 for prepaying and \$20 at the gate. Dave Ritchie seconded the motion, and it passed. (6) Ray will be checking on the trophies. (7) A suggestion was made to have Club volunteers sign up for a shift rather than the whole day. (8) If anyone is thinking that he/she would like to co-chair the TSS in the future, it would be a good idea to shadow/team with Ray and Dave this year. This would help to make a seamless transition.

The next meeting will be at the Apple Valley American Legion Post 1776, on Thursday, February 12, 2026 at 7:00 p.m. Ron Willson made a motion to adjourn the meeting. It was seconded by Ray Valdovinos, and the motion carried. The meeting was adjourned.
